




29% of England's private social housing stock

... but only 6% above level 3 NQF



Average budget: £72,000 p/a

Average actual spend in 2011/12 was £70k

59% had a tree inventory

No difference of large vs small

75% were created by external consultants

Average of 3731 trees



Strong relationship between presence of inventory and level of planned tree works

	Inventory present	Inventory not present
Programme of tree works	56%	16%
No programme of tree works	4%	24%

- 54% have a GIS
- Of those that have a GIS, 72% have trees mapped
- 39% of respondents have trees mapped on a GIS





66% had a policy/strategy document

Documents reviewed were highlevel policies rather than long-term strategies
