

What is 'forest ownership'?



FAO Forest Resources Assessment definition:


"the legal right to freely and exclusively use, control, transfer, or otherwise benefit from a forest."

But: most owners don't have all those rights:

- **1. Access** rights (rights to enter forest land);
- 2. Withdrawal rights (rights to harvest or remove timber, firewood and NWFPs);
- 3. Management rights (rights to plan internal forest activities and transform the forest);
- 4. Exclusion rights (rights to prevent others from accessing and harvesting wood or NWFPs);
- 5. Alienation rights (rights to sell forestland and forest products as well as to lease or sell management and exclusion rights)






Public ownership in more detail




Private ownership in more detail




Proportion of total area of private land owned by different types of private owners






Forest condition and utilisation






Forest utilisation rate






