•Roadway planners ust consider the risk of roadside trees against the benefits

RESEARCH QUESTIONS

• What is the impact of land use (urban/rural), vehicle type, light conditions, and weather conditions on tree crash frequency?

• Are tree crashes more severe than other single-vehicle accidents?

- Chi Square Tests for Proportion
- Ordered Logic Regression


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SINGLE VEHICLE CRASHES

TREE CRASH FREQUENCY RESULTS

- Tree Crashes more common in rural conditions than urban conditions
- Tree crashes most common in dark conditions with lighting present
- •No impact of drugs/alcohol on tree frequency

SEVERITY RESULTS

• Tree Crashes are more severe than all other single-vehicle crashes, except for rollovers

TAKEAWAY

- The role of roadside trees in roadway planning is complex and multi-faceted
- Must balance benefits with risks
- Need for future research
