## Wednesday 10 April

- Session 1 Opportunities and constraints in global forestry and sustainable development goals**  
What are the big issues globally surrounding our use of trees and forests? What opportunities and constraints is this creating?
- Session 2 Delivering economic benefits from the world's forests**  
We are told timber is a vital resource for a sustainable global future but what are the current and future main drivers for global supply and demand? Where does the UK fit in to this?
- Session 3 Delivering social benefits from the world's forests**  
Communities benefit from forests in many different ways. For some, they are essential for livelihoods. In urban areas, trees are important for our mental and physical health. How do we increase the social connections we have with Forests? The UK helps contribute to some exciting socially led forestry projects around the world. We will hear from some examples.
